Short Fiction: Identifying Theme · CCSS.ELA-LITERACY.RL.7.2

This week's learning goals

Students will identify the theme of a short story and analyze how it develops through character decisions. Students will write a 1-paragraph text-based claim with at least one piece of evidence by Friday's exit ticket.

OBJECTIVE Define "theme" vs. topic; generate examples from familiar stories ACTIVITIES Warm-up: think-pair-share "what is the lesson of Cinderella?" Mini-lesson: anchor chart theme vs. topic. Read "The Gift of the Magi" aloud (pp. 1–3) MATERIALS Anchor chart paper, O. Henry text packets, highlighters HOMEWORK Finish reading pp. 4–8	OBJECTIVE Trace how character decisions reveal theme in "Gift of the Magi" ACTIVITIES Character decision map (graphic organizer). Small group: "What does Jim's choice tell us about what the story values?" Whole-class share MATERIALS Character decision graphic organizer (printed), text packets HOMEWORK Complete graphic organizer if unfinished	OBJECTIVE Draft a theme statement; support with textual evidence ACTIVITIES Model: write theme statement from graphic organizer. Students draft own theme statement. Peer review with sentence stem: "Your theme is clear/unclear because..." MATERIALS Writing notebooks, sentence-stem handout, text packets HOMEWORK Revise theme statement based on peer feedback	OBJECTIVE Write a full paragraph: theme claim + 1 piece of cited evidence + explanation ACTIVITIES Mini-lesson: how to cite page/line in prose. Independent writing: complete the claim paragraph. Teacher conferences with IEP students (Jordan, Mia, Theo — extended time) MATERIALS Writing notebooks, text packets, reference: citation format on board HOMEWORK Finish paragraph draft for Friday exit ticket	OBJECTIVE Demonstrate understanding of theme with independent written evidence ACTIVITIES Warm-up: 3 rapid-fire theme/topic distinctions (whiteboard). Exit ticket (10 min): theme statement + evidence from a second short story (fresh read). Brief class share-out MATERIALS Exit ticket handout, "The Necklace" excerpt (3 pages), whiteboards HOMEWORK None — great week, enjoy the weekend

Notes & Reminders

What to prep for next week

→ Jordan, Mia, Theo: IEP extended time on Thursday writing / Friday exit ticket

→ Team meeting Tues at 3:45pm — bring unit map
